- Does your drinking water or waste water treatment require use or storage of chlorine gas, sulfur dioxide, 20% through anhydrous ammonia, methane, and/or chlorine dioxide?

When these chemicals are used for drinking or waste water treatment, the facilities that store and/or use them become subject to the EPA Risk Management Program. All facilities are required to have a Risk Management Plan (RMP) if they have these chemicals. Facilities over specific thresholds must submit their RMP to the EPA; however, the General Duty Clause requires any facility using or storing to have an RMP.

### Course Overview

This primary goal and design of this course is to help water and wastewater facility management and personnel understand the requirements of the EPA Risk Management Program regulations and to provide information on how to conduct an internal Compliance Audit of your RMP program.

The course provides tips and resources on implementing the requirements of EPA Risk Management Program regulations in a manner that will satisfy EPA inspectors and improve the safety of your employees, the public, and the environment.
